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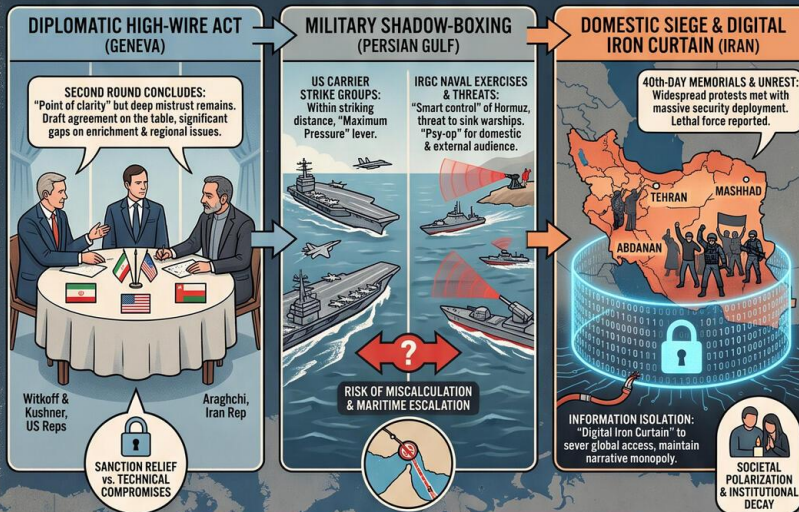

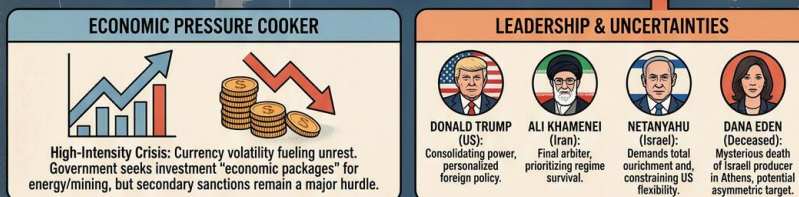
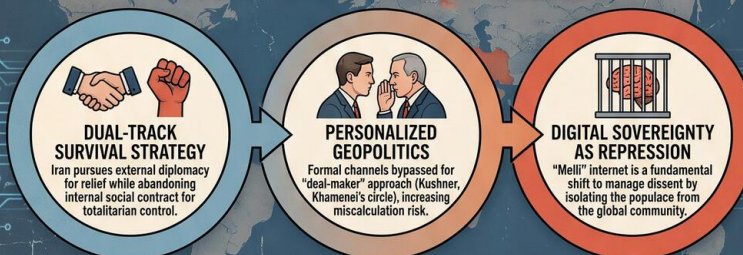

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 17, 2026, marks a critical juncture in the confrontation between the Islamic Republic of Iran and the United States, as high-stakes **nuclear and regional security negotiations** conclude a second round in Geneva. The talks, mediated by Oman and featuring senior US representatives including Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner, have reached a "point of clarity" but remain bogged down in deep-seated mutual mistrust. While the Iranian delegation, led by Abbas Araghchi, signals a willingness to offer "technical compromises" in exchange for the lifting of **crippling sanctions**, the domestic landscape in Iran is increasingly volatile. The government is struggling to contain widespread civil unrest as the nation observes the 40th-day memorials for protesters killed during the "Dey" (January) uprisings, leading to a massive deployment of security forces and sophisticated **internet censorship** measures.

Simultaneously, a military shadow-boxing match is unfolding in the Persian Gulf. The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) has launched naval exercises focused on "smart control" of the Strait of Hormuz, a direct response to the provocative deployment of two US carrier strike groups—the USS Gerald R. Ford and USS Abraham Lincoln—within striking distance of Iranian waters. This convergence of **diplomatic overtures and military posturing** suggests a "maximum pressure" environment where both sides are leveraging the threat of total conflict to secure better terms at the negotiating table. The internal instability of the Iranian regime, characterized by institutional decay and a "nationalized" internet designed to sever the population from the global community, remains the primary wild card that could derail the diplomatic track.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Geneva Diplomatic Track Ends Second Round:** Negotiations between Iran and the US concluded with both sides agreeing to work on a draft text for a potential "broad agreement," though significant gaps remain regarding enrichment levels, missile ranges, and regional proxy support [negotiations ended](#).
- **Naval Brinkmanship in the Strait of Hormuz:** The IRGC initiated naval drills as US carrier strike groups moved to within 700 kilometers of the Iranian coast, with Tehran threatening to **sink American warships** if conflict erupts [naval threat](#).

- **Domestic "Dey" Uprising Memorials:** Heavy security presence and internet blackouts were reported across major cities (Tehran, Mashhad, Abadan) as families attempted to mark the 40th day since the January protest killings [protest memorials](#).
- **Advancements in Digital Repression:** Iranian authorities are reportedly deploying a "Melli" (National) internet filter to bypass VPNs and isolate domestic traffic, a move described by analysts as a "digital iron curtain" [internet censorship](#).
- **Russian-Ukrainian Peace Overtures in Geneva:** Parallel to the Iran talks, Russian and Ukrainian delegations met in Geneva under US mediation, though Moscow continues to strike Ukrainian energy infrastructure [Ukraine talks](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Armed Conflict & Militarization: The deployment of the USS Gerald R. Ford and USS Abraham Lincoln represents a significant escalation in US military posture. Iran has responded with IRGC naval maneuvers, specifically testing "smart control" systems for the Strait of Hormuz to counter US radar and electronic warfare capabilities [radar impact](#).

Macroeconomics & Trade: Iran is pitching an "economic package" to the US, hoping to lure American investment into energy and mining sectors as a "sustainability" guarantee for any new nuclear deal [economic proposal](#).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Dual-Track Survival Strategy: The Iranian regime is pursuing a bifurcated strategy. Externally, it is engaging in high-level diplomacy to secure sanction relief and economic breathing room. Internally, it has abandoned all pretense of social contract, relying instead on **totalitarian digital control** and paramilitary violence to suppress a population that no longer views the government as legitimate [regime legitimacy](#). This "diplomacy for survival" is increasingly desperate as domestic anger reaches a boiling point.

Personalized Geopolitics: The prominence of individuals like Jared Kushner and Steve Witkoff on the US side, and the direct involvement of the Supreme Leader's inner circle on the Iranian side, indicates that formal institutional diplomacy is being bypassed in favor of a "deal-maker" approach. This trend increases the risk of **miscalculation**, as both sides may

overestimate their ability to control their respective hardline domestic factions [negotiation gaps](#).

Digital Sovereignty as Repression: The shift from "filtering" to a "National Internet" (Melli) is a fundamental change in how the Iranian state manages dissent. By creating an isolated network, the regime can maintain essential services for the elite and the military while completely cutting off the public from external information and organization tools [National Internet](#).

INTERNAL DYNAMICS & DOMESTIC INSTABILITY

- **Institutional Decay:** Reports from within Iran suggest a breakdown in basic governance, with hospitals becoming sites of **security surveillance** rather than healing, and families of the deceased being coerced into silence or forced to adopt state-sanctioned mourning narratives [hospital surveillance](#).

- **Propaganda & Censorship:** The "Melli" internet project is not just about blocking sites; it's about **narrative monopoly**. By controlling the digital space, the state can project an image of calm and unity to the outside world while crushing dissent in the dark [censorship strategy](#).
- **Psychological Operations:** The IRGC's naval drills are a "psy-op" aimed at both the US military and the Iranian domestic audience, designed to show that the regime is not afraid of "sinking" American prestige [naval psy-op](#).

HYPOTHESES AND FUTURE OUTLOOK

- **Escalation Trap:** If Geneva fails, the US is likely to "escalate to de-escalate," potentially striking Iranian missile sites or naval facilities. Iran's response would likely be **asymmetric and maritime**, focusing on closing the Strait of Hormuz.

- **The "Melli" Internet Threshold:** Once the National Internet is fully operational, the state may feel emboldened to carry out even more severe repression, as the "cost" of being caught by the international media decreases.

GAPS & BLIND SPOTS

- **Araghchi's Mandate:** It remains unclear if Araghchi has the Supreme Leader's authority to make real concessions or if he is simply "buying time" while the IRGC fortifies domestic positions [negotiation mandate](#).
- **Russian-Iranian Military Cooperation:** The extent to which Russia is providing electronic warfare or "Melli" internet tech to Tehran is implied but not detailed [Russian-Iranian tech](#).
