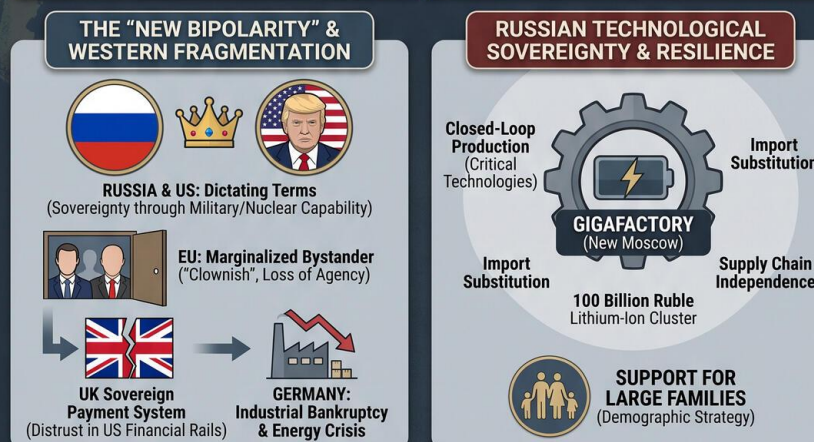

A Fragile Peace in Geneva Amid Escalating Global Militarization & Systemic Fragmentation

Day-at-a-Glance: High-stakes Russia-US-Ukraine talks exclude EU, signaling 'Great Power Bilateralism'. Parallel Middle East crisis (US-Iran) threatens Hormuz blockade. Russian 'negotiation through escalation' with massive kinetic campaign on Ukraine energy. West faces fragmentation and decay, while Russia pivots to technological sovereignty.



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A FRAGILE PEACE IN GENEVA AMID ESCALATING GLOBAL MILITARIZATION AND THE SYSTEMIC FRAGMENTATION OF WESTERN ALLIANCES

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 17, 2026, is dominated by the launch of high-stakes **trilateral negotiations** in Geneva between Russia, the United States, and Ukraine. The diplomatic atmosphere is characterized by a conspicuous exclusion of the European Union, signaling a shift toward a **Great Power bilateralism** reminiscent of the Cold War. While the Russian delegation, led by Vladimir Medinsky, maintains a rigid stance on territorial gains, the narrative emphasizes internal fracturing within the Ukrainian leadership and Donald Trump's direct pressure on Kyiv to accept concessions. This diplomatic movement is juxtaposed with a massive Russian kinetic campaign targeting the Ukrainian **energy grid and logistics hubs**, suggesting a strategy of "negotiation through escalation."

Simultaneously, the global risk profile is heightened by a separate but parallel crisis in the Middle East. US-Iran negotiations in

Geneva are described as being on the **brink of collapse**, with the US deploying additional carrier strike groups and Iran conducting aggressive naval exercises in the Strait of Hormuz. THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

Each high-level insight is connected back to the original broadcast, allowing journalists and scholars to understand the dominate themes and trends and instantly click out to the underlying sources for details.

By helping journalists and scholars see the broader trends and patterns of global news coverage, this analysis helps them identify

relevant stories and coverage they might not otherwise have encountered and uncover connections, emphases and narrative shifts that enable more comprehensive reporting and deeper, evidence-based research.

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
