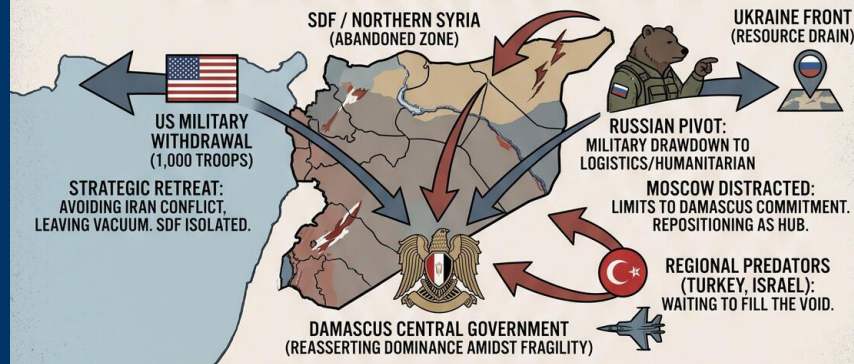

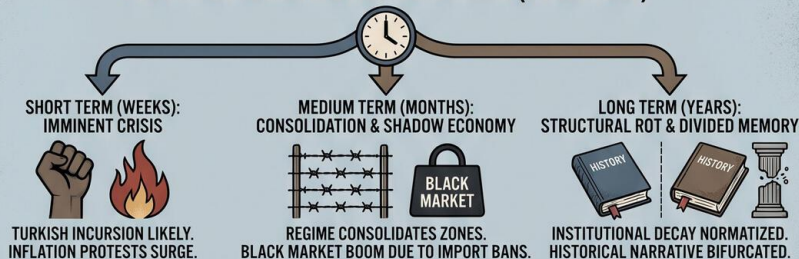

SYRIA AT A GEOPOLITICAL AND SOCIAL INFLECTION POINT: US WITHDRAWAL AND THE CRISIS OF NATIONAL MEMORY

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 19, 2026, marks a watershed moment for the Syrian landscape as international shifts collide with a deepening domestic struggle over history and governance. The lead development is the confirmed report of a full **US military withdrawal** from Syria, involving approximately 1,000 personnel. This move is framed as a strategic retreat to avoid direct conflict with Iran and is viewed by regional analysts as a abandonment of the Kurdish-led regions, potentially inviting Turkish or regime incursions. This external vacuum is mirrored by an internal Russian pivot, as Moscow appears to be transitioning its Syrian presence from a military posture to a logistical and "humanitarian" one, likely due to the ongoing resource drain of the war in **Ukraine**. The "Caesar Families Association" and human rights groups have launched a significant protest against the use of former detention centers and "crime scenes" as filming locations, arguing that dramatizing the torture of the past 14 years for entertainment violates the dignity of the victims and compromises **transitional justice**. This cultural friction coincides with a massive corruption scandal involving the **Syrian Aviation** sector and the Central Auditing Body, where billions of Syrian pounds have been embezzled. As Ramadan begins, the Syrian populace faces a "perfect storm" of hyperinflation, institutional decay, and a state apparatus attempting to codify its version of history through a controversial new **Media Code of Conduct**.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

US Military Withdrawal from Northern Syria

- US officials confirmed plans to withdraw all [1,000 troops](#) currently stationed in Syria within the next two months.

- The Central Auditing Body reported revenues of 89 billion SYP, but revealed a massive [electronic embezzlement](#) scheme within Syrian Aviation totaling **65 billion SYP**.
- The scandal has triggered a "cleansing" of the [auditing ranks](#), with dozens of officials dismissed or referred for investigation.
- The government is attempting to frame this as an "anti-corruption" drive to regain public trust amid **economic collapse**.

Battle Over Media Governance and Censorship

- A new "Media Code of Conduct" (Moudawana) has sparked a [rebellion among journalists](#) who view it as a veiled tool for state censorship.
- The Ministry of Information is accused of using the code to [monopolize the narrative](#) and suppress independent reporting on humanitarian and human rights issues.

- Journalists are calling for the code to be [independent of the ministry](#) to ensure protection for whistleblowers and critics.

Armed Conflict & Militarization

- The transition of US bases to "humanitarian platforms" is being monitored by [regional actors](#).

Syria is increasingly framed as a **strategic abandonment zone** for Western powers. The US withdrawal is portrayed as a [calculated retreat](#) to de-escalate with Iran, leaving the SDF in a [perilous position](#). Russia is

repositioning itself as a [logistical hub](#), signaling that its military commitment to Damascus has reached its limit due to the [Ukrainian conflict](#). Turkey and Israel remain opportunistic, with Ankara poised to [expand its northern buffer](#) and Israel continuing strikes to prevent Iranian entrenchment in the vacuum left by the US.

THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

The economic climate is characterized by **institutionalized theft** and hyperinflation. Markets are pricing in the [shortages](#) expected during Ramadan, with a consensus that the state's [monetary indicators](#) are unreliable.
