

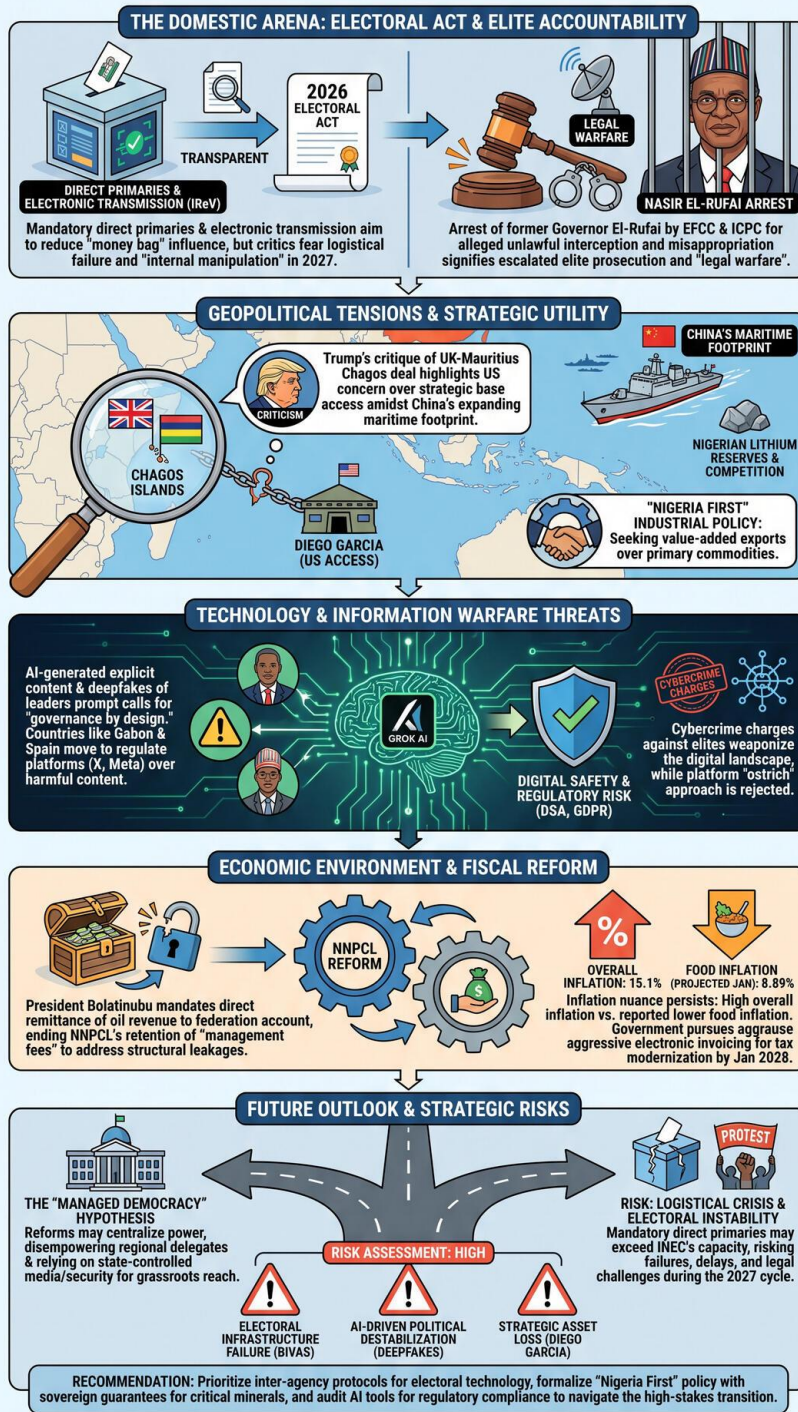

NIGERIA NAVIGATES A HIGH-STAKES TRANSITION: Electoral Reforms, Elite Prosecution, & AI-Driven Geopolitics.



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NIGERIA NAVIGATES A HIGH-STAKES TRANSITION MARKED BY SWEEPING ELECTORAL REFORMS, INTENSIFIED ELITE PROSECUTION, AND THE RISING GEOPOLITICAL THREAT OF AI-DRIVEN INFORMATION WARFARE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 19, 2026, represents a critical junction for Nigerian governance, characterized by the simultaneous enactment of the **2026 Electoral Act** and a aggressive crackdown on prominent political figures. The administration of President Bolatinubu is attempting to consolidate power through systemic reforms—specifically the mandating of [direct primaries](#) and electronic transmission of results—while concurrently navigating the fallout of the arrest of former Kaduna State Governor **Nasir El-Rufai**. - **Macroeconomic Shifts and NNPC Reform:** President Bolatinubu has issued an executive order mandating the direct remittance of [oil and gas revenues](#) to the federation account, attempting to end the NNPC's practice of retaining "management fees" and profit oil that previously starved state governments of revenue [for salary payments](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Leadership Dynamics & Governance: The Bolatinubu administration is projecting an image of a "listening president" [through electoral reforms](#), yet the focus on high-profile arrests suggests a strategy of neutralizing internal rivals. The move to shorten election notice periods from 360 to 300 days [raises concerns](#) about the capacity of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to manage the logistics of a nationwide direct primary system.
