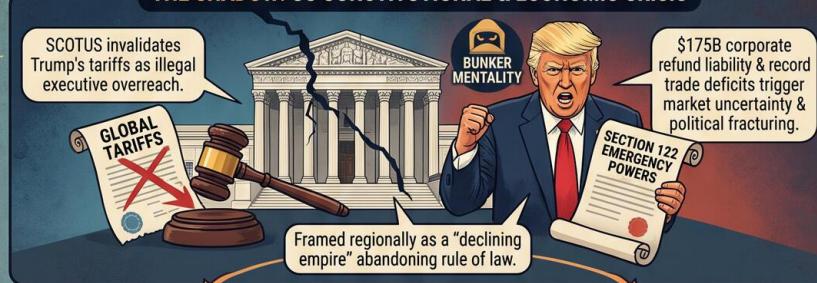

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The reporting on February 21, 2026, reveals a region in high friction, characterized by the Venezuelan government's aggressive implementation of a **national amnesty** framework. This legislative push is framed as a "reconciliation" effort, yet it appears strategically timed to consolidate power and manage domestic dissent following the alleged "kidnapping" of Nicolás Maduro and Cilia Flores by US military forces on January 3. Acting President Delcy Rodríguez is leveraging this amnesty to release thousands of detainees while maintaining a narrative of [resistance against imperialist aggression](#). This domestic maneuver is paired with a diplomatic pivot toward Colombia to secure energy and trade integration, suggesting an

attempt to build a regional "anti-imperialist" bloc.

Simultaneously, **Ecuador** is facing a profound governance crisis. Indigenous and peasant movements are actively organizing a [revocation of mandate](#) for President Daniel Noboa (variously referred to as Daniel Lobo in transcripts). This movement is driven by a combination of severe state repression—including reports of mutilations and "state terrorism"—and a worsening economic environment exacerbated by a 30% tariff on Colombian imports. The trade tension between Quito and Bogotá has triggered supply chain disruptions and significant inflation, leaving the Noboa administration increasingly isolated and reliant on [surveillance and criminalization](#) of social leaders to maintain order.

INFORMATION WARFARE ENVIRONMENT

- **The "Maduro Martyrdom" Consolidation:** If Maduro remains in US custody, the Rodríguez administration will likely use the "Amnesty" as a tool to **purge the opposition** of anyone who does not explicitly denounce the US action, creating a single-party state under the guise of unity.
- **Ecuadorian Collapse:** The convergence of **indigenous strikes** and the **trade war with Colombia** makes a Noboa resignation or mandate revocation **highly likely** within the next 60 days, potentially leading to a socialist-populist resurgence in Quito.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect **mass releases** of low-level political prisoners in Venezuela to gain international leverage, alongside **escalating protests** at the Rumichaca bridge between Ecuador and Colombia as transportistas revolt [against tariffs](#).
