JULY 14-15, 2026: A PERIOD OF ACUTE STRATEGIC TENSION & CONVERGENCE OF CRISES



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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

July 14-15, 2026, marks a period of acute strategic tension for Pakistan, characterized by a dangerous convergence of regional military escalation and domestic institutional friction. Externally, the Middle East has entered a cycle of direct kinetic confrontation between the United States and Iran, following a series of tanker attacks in the Persian Gulf and massive retaliatory strikes. Pakistan finds itself in a precarious diplomatic position, attempting to mediate through "shuttle diplomacy" by Chief of Army Staff (COAS) Asim Munir and Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif while its own border security is threatened by spillover from Afghanistan. The state is actively projecting a posture of "principled neutrality" while simultaneously seeking deepened military and economic ties with Turkey and Qatar to offset internal vulnerabilities.

Domestically, the Pakistani state is engaged in a high-stakes information war to preserve the "sanctity of the military" following controversial remarks by Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman regarding the compensation of martyrs. This has triggered a massive, coordinated state-media response aimed at delegitimizing political dissent by equating it with an affront to national security. Simultaneously, the government is struggling to suppress a escalating civil unrest movement in Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) and a deteriorating security situation in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), where state writ is openly challenged after sunset. The administration is leveraging the "cashless economy" initiative and I.T. export growth as evidence of resilience, even as the stock market and commodity prices react to the specter of a broader regional war.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Regional Military Escalation:** The US has conducted three consecutive days of strikes against 90 Iranian targets in response to tanker attacks in the Persian Gulf and strikes in Jordan. Iran has retaliated against US bases in the Gulf and threatened to close the Strait of Hormuz, causing [global oil prices to spike by 9%](#).
- **Operation Shaban/Shauban:** A large-scale counter-terrorism operation is underway in Balochistan and KP against "Fitna al-Khawarij" (TTP) and associated groups. Security forces have reportedly killed [over 123 militants since July 5](#), though the state admits significant challenges to its writ in border regions.

- **Political Crisis over Martyrdom Narrative:** Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman's comments linking soldier sacrifices to "salaries" have sparked a [unprecedented backlash from the cabinet](#) and military leadership, who characterize the remarks as a "threat to national unity."
- **Azad Kashmir Unrest:** Clashes between the Joint Action Committee and security forces in Rawalakot have resulted in [the martyrdom of a Ranger](#) and injuries to dozens, with the state accusing the movement of using "human shields" and having an "anti-state agenda."
- **Economic Digitalization Push:** The government reports a significant surge in mobile banking users (from 95 million to 137 million) and a [300% increase in active QR code merchants](#) as part of a transition to a "cashless economy."

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

- **Armed Conflict & Militarization:** Operation Shaban remains the central domestic military focus, with air and ground assets deployed in Balochistan to neutralize "foreign-backed" insurgents. The military is also managing [complex internal security threats in Bannu](#) and surrounding areas.
- **Civil Unrest & Social Order:** The situation in AJK has reached a flashpoint, with the government declaring a "zero-tolerance" policy against protesters who have blocked major highways. The state frames this as a [conspiracy to destroy the peace of Kashmir](#).

- **Diplomacy & Statecraft:** COAS General Asim Munir's visit to Turkey resulted in him receiving the [highest Turkish military award](#), signaling a deepening of the "strategic brotherly bond" as Pakistan seeks to modernize its defense apparatus.
- **Terrorism & Asymmetric Threats:** Intelligence reports highlight a "nexus" between "Fitna al-Khawarij," "Fitna al-Hindustan," and Jamaat-ul-Ahrar, with training and planning [traced back to Afghan soil](#).
- **Information Warfare & Disinformation:** The state has launched a massive campaign to counter "anti-state narratives" on social media, claiming that [20% of accounts are involved in malicious activities](#).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Martyrdom: A dominant theme is the use of the "martyr" (Shaheed) as an untouchable political symbol. By framing Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman's criticism as an attack on the military's soul, the state is effectively [shutting down debate](#) on the human and financial cost of ongoing counter-insurgency efforts. This signals a trend where political legitimacy is increasingly tied to one's proximity to the military's ideological red lines.

Proxy War Narrative Seeding: Pakistan is aggressively pushing the narrative that all domestic unrest—from AJK protests to Baloch insurgencies—is the result of a coordinated "Indian proxy" effort using Afghan territory. This narrative serves to [externalize internal failures](#) and justify the use of heavy kinetic force against civilian-led movements.

Transition to Controlled Digitalization: The push for a "cashless economy" is

presented as a modernization success, but between the lines, it functions as a mechanism for [increased financial surveillance and tax documentation](#). This is critical as the state faces a widening trade deficit and the need to meet international financial commitments.

INTERNAL DYNAMICS & DOMESTIC INSTABILITY

Pakistan is facing a profound crisis of institutional writ. In KP, commentators and politicians admit that [the government's writ vanishes at night](#), with militant groups moving freely. The elite political environment is hyper-polarized; the cabinet has spent the bulk of its energy attacking Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman, indicating that internal factionalism is distracting from governance. In AJK, the transition from economic demands (electricity prices) to an "insurrectionary" movement suggests a loss of the government's mandate in the territory. Furthermore, the introduction of a bill to grant ["VIP Blue Passports" to parliamentarians and their children](#) amidst a national economic crisis highlights a growing disconnect between the ruling class and a public burdened by inflation and security fears.

EXTERNAL DYNAMICS & GLOBAL POSTURE

Pakistan's global posture is one of defensive maneuvering in a "hostile threat matrix." The international system is portrayed as increasingly anarchic, particularly with the US and Iran on the brink of war. Pakistan is positioning itself as a [potential mediator](#) to prevent a regional collapse that would destroy its energy supply lines. The military's "Strategic Brotherly" outreach to Turkey and

Qatar is a move to secure non-Western support and defense technology. Simultaneously, the state portrays India as being in "internal chaos" (citing Manipur and press freedom declines) to [counter India's regional dominance](#).

THE ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT

The economic climate is overshadowed by the regional energy crisis, though the state highlights specific I.T. sector gains. Market sentiment is bearish due to the US-Iran conflict.

- **Commodities:** Brent crude jumped to [\\$86.9 per barrel](#) following a 9% daily spike. Locally, there is a push to update refinery policies to reduce reliance on imported diesel.
- **Currency & Markets:** The Euro is trading at [316.64 rupees](#). The stock market has shown a "negative trajectory" due to international escalations.
- **Trade & Growth:** I.T. exports reached [\\$4.5 billion](#), a 29% year-on-year increase. Car sales rose 39% due to improved financing and new models.
- **Digitalization:** Digital payments through QR codes saw a [300% increase](#), aimed at curbing the undocumented economy.

LEADERSHIP CHANGES

The reporting focuses on the consolidation of current leadership and the marginalization of traditional religious-political figures.

- **Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman:** Currently faces a [coordinated campaign of political isolation](#). His traditional role as a kingmaker is being stripped away as the state labels his rhetoric as "anti-national."

- **General Asim Munir:** Portrayed as the [architect of regional security](#), receiving international accolades and managing high-level diplomatic files in Turkey.
- **Mohammad Ishaq Dar:** Emerging as a key diplomatic figure, meeting with [SAARC and UN officials](#) to secure Pakistan's regional standing.

EDITORIAL POSTURE & STORY HIERARCHY

PTV News maintains a fiercely nationalistic and pro-military editorial posture. The **Lead Stories** consistently revolve around "Operation Shaban" successes, the condemnation of Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman, and the diplomatic "triumphs" of the COAS. These are designed to induce a sense of national pride and unity under threat. **Buried Stories** include the specific grievances of the AJK protesters and the nuanced reasons for the government's loss of writ in KP border districts. **Conspicuous Omissions** include any critical analysis of the "Blue Passport" bill's impact on public sentiment or independent verification of the civilian casualty counts in AJK and KP operations.

GEOPOLITICAL FRAMING

The subtext reveals a world viewed through the lens of proxy warfare and "Great Power" indifference.

- **Iran:** Portrayed as a "brotherly" but ["emotional" and "overconfident"](#) actor whose miscalculations in the Gulf are endangering regional stability.
- **USA:** Framed as a "parental figure" to the Pakistani elite (the "May-Baap" narrative) but also as a [destabilizing force](#) whose interests often conflict with regional peace.

- **India:** Portrayed as "weak and chaotic," with state-sponsored reports focusing on ["racial riots" in Manipur](#) and "failures in Nagaland" to diminish India's image of regional competence.
- **Turkey:** Portrayed as a "strong and stable" model for Pakistan, with its military and leadership treated as the [ultimate strategic partner](#).

INFORMATION WARFARE ENVIRONMENT

- **Narrative Seeding:** The state is heavily seeding the term "Fitna al-Khawarij" to label the TTP, [religiously delegitimizing the group](#) while framing military action as a holy duty.
- **Censorship & Manipulation:** PTV provides one-sided coverage of the AJK unrest, showing only "human shield" narratives and [ignoring the underlying economic protests](#).
- **Psy-Ops:** The broadcasting of "martyr's family" interviews is used as a psychological tool to [silence political criticism](#) of the defense budget and military strategy.

HYPOTHESES AND FUTURE OUTLOOK

- **Escalation in AJK:** The "zero-tolerance" policy in AJK likely indicates an [imminent crackdown](#) that could lead to a sustained insurgency if local economic grievances remain unaddressed.
- **Energy Crisis:** If the Iran-US conflict continues for more than two weeks, Pakistan will face [severe fuel rationing](#) and a possible economic standstill as Brent prices cross the \$100 threshold.

- **Political Realignment:** The attack on Fazl-ur-Rehman signals a permanent shift away from the traditional "consensus politics," leading toward a more [autocratic governance model](#) justified by national security emergencies.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect massive arrests of Joint Action Committee members in AJK and a further "cleaning" of social media platforms as the state [implements new cyber-surveillance tools](#).
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Shift toward an "Energy Emergency" budget as the trade deficit widens due to [high oil costs](#). Pakistan may formalize a new defense production treaty with Turkey.
- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** Structural transition to a fully digital, tracked economy, with the [elimination of the informal cash sector](#) to facilitate debt repayment and surveillance.

RISK ASSESSMENT

- **Regional War Spilling into Pakistan:** Triggered by US-Iran kinetic strikes hitting Iranian border provinces; Likelihood: Moderate/High; Impact: Catastrophic destruction of trade and potential refugee influx; Mitigation: [Immediate neutrality declaration](#) and shuttle diplomacy.
- **Collapse of State Writ in KP:** Triggered by the TTP seizing control of more border districts during night hours; Likelihood: High; Impact: Loss of sovereign control over vast territories; Mitigation: [Reinforcing paramilitary presence](#) and negotiating local tribal militias.

- **Hyper-inflation Shock:** Triggered by oil crossing \$110/bbl due to the closure of the Strait of Hormuz; Likelihood: Moderate; Impact: Civil unrest in urban centers; Mitigation: [Accelerated refinery reforms](#) and emergency subsidies.
- **Azad Kashmir Insurgency:** Triggered by civilian deaths in Rawalakot during a crackdown; Likelihood: Moderate/High; Impact: Permanent instability in the most sensitive strategic territory; Mitigation: [Immediate release of political prisoners](#) and tariff reductions.
- **Internal Institutional Decay:** Triggered by the "VIP Passport" bill causing a public revolt; Likelihood: Low/Moderate; Impact: Loss of elite legitimacy; Mitigation: [Withdrawal of the bill](#) and austerity measures.

GAPS & BLIND SPOTS

- The broadcasts fail to report the [exact nature of civilian grievances](#) in AJK, framing it entirely as a security issue rather than a cost-of-living crisis.
- There is no discussion of the [specific military losses](#) in the KP "sunset writ" zones, only general success metrics for Operation Shaban.
- The report on I.T. exports lacks context on how [global tech layoffs](#) or AI advancements might hinder the 29% growth trend.
- The US-Iran conflict reporting relies heavily on [state-affiliated sources from all three sides](#), with little independent verification of target destruction or casualty counts.

CONTRARIAN NARRATIVE SCENARIOS

- **Strategic Stalling:** The diplomatic mediation efforts with Iran might actually be a [stalling tactic](#) to allow the US and allies to reposition assets while Pakistan secures its own energy reserves.
- **Artificial Crisis:** The "martyrdom" controversy may have been [narratively seeded by the state](#) specifically to provide a pretext for silencing Maulana Fazl-ur-Rehman and consolidating power ahead of expected economic shocks.
- **Black Swan Event:** An unplanned kinetic exchange between Indian and Pakistani forces in Kashmir, [triggered by unrest in AJK](#), leading to a two-front war scenario while Pakistan is focused on the West.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For Statecraft/Public Sector:

- Prioritize the [energy diversification strategy](#) to include non-Gulf sources to mitigate the risk of Strait of Hormuz closure.
- Immediately de-escalate in AJK through [political rather than kinetic means](#) to prevent the emergence of a new militant front.

- Investors should hedge against [high energy input costs](#) in manufacturing as regional tensions persist.
